He contributed to several multidisciplinary conferences at Penrose Hospital including GI and liver, thoracic, pulmonary and breast, and led a quality assurance project tasked with improving turnaround time for breast specimens. Additionally, he gained valuable experience while performing and evaluating over 200 bone marrows and aspirations.

Dr. Rodman then completed a gastrointestinal pathology fellowship in Cleveland, OH, under the directorship of Robert E. Petras, a world-renowned gastrointestinal pathologist.
